### Ohio School Safety Center

## **Armed School Staff Essential Training Program**

### **Ohio School Safety Center**

Legislated under the 134th General Assembly, House Bill 99 permits a school district board or governing body to elect to arm specific staff members as well as the mandated training requirements for those individuals. The OSSCs model curriculum is called, "Armed School Staff Essential Training (ASSET)".
