Back-to-School Campaign

The SchoolSafety.gov Back-to-School Campaign highlights resources and guidance that K-12 school leaders, educators, staff, and parents and caregivers can use to help prepare for a safe return to school. The campaign aims to empower K-12 communities to use SchoolSafety.gov tools and resources before, during, and beyond the back-to-school season to create and sustain safe and supportive learning environments for students and educators.

The **Back-to-School Checklist** outlines seven potential school safety actions that K-12 school leaders and personnel can consider to help create safe and supportive learning environments. These actions include exercising emergency operations plans, enhancing student and staff mental health literacy, and increasing awareness of school safety reporting options.



The <u>Back-to-School Reading List</u> offers ten resources that provide guidance and insights on timely school safety issues. These topics include bullying prevention, student mental health, cybersecurity, and emergency planning.



The **Back-to-School Communications Toolkit** provides information on campaign resources, SchoolSafety.gov tools, and ready-to-use communications content that K-12 school leaders and community members can use to learn more about school safety actions and raise awareness of SchoolSafety.gov.

Who We Are

SchoolSafety.gov is an interagency website created by the federal government to provide schools and districts with actionable recommendations to create safe and supportive learning environments. The site serves as a one-stop resource library for information, guidance, and evidence-based practices on a range of school safety topics.

SchoolSafety.gov is operated by the Federal School Safety Clearinghouse, an interagency effort among the Departments of Education, Health and Human Services, Homeland Security, and Justice. The Clearinghouse serves as an ongoing and coordinated effort that includes regular interagency review of evidence-based content and recommended best practices to keep schools safe, as well as the curation and distribution of resources, guidance, and tools for school communities across the country.

Resources and Features

SchoolSafety.gov offers more than 650 resources to help inform and support schools as they develop, enhance, and implement school safety plans, procedures, and programs. Through the site, schools and districts can also find valuable tools to identify, learn about, and connect with important resources to address specific safety needs or create comprehensive and holistic school safety plans. SchoolSafety.gov tools include:

- **Grants Finder Tool**: Identify and stay up to date on school safety-related federal funding opportunities.
- **Safety Readiness Tool**: Evaluate school safety measures across ten elements and receive a tailored action plan with options for consideration and aligned resources and grant opportunities.
- **State Search Tool**: Locate and access state-specific school safety resources, programs, contacts, and opportunities.
- **Resource Library**: Discover resources, guidance, training, and fact sheets that can be filtered by categories such as audience, intended application, and topic.
- **Calendar of Events**: Search webinars, training sessions, and conferences for school leaders, educators, staff, and parents and caregivers.
- **Communications Center**: Explore issue briefs, presentations, newsletter bulletins, and materials available from SchoolSafety.gov.
